The University of Louisiana at Lafayette is committed to providing clear and accurate information to current and prospective students to help inform career planning. The UL Lafayette program identified above prepares students to practice in a field with professional licensure or certification available. However, specific licensure and certification requirements can and often do vary by state. Requirements typically include earning a degree or other educational credential in the field from an institution and program that meet certain eligibility requirements in that state (e.g., curricular requirements, accredited status, approval by the state licensing board); passing a state or national exam; working in the field for a minimum period of time; and/or completing a certain number of clinical hours. If your career plans include pursuing professional licensure or certification in your chosen field, it is important to become educated on the credentialing requirements of the state in which you hope to practice.

UL Lafayette Program Preparation in the State of Louisiana

In the bachelor's in accounting program, you will gain the knowledge to prepare for and pass the CPA Exam and complete the educational requirement for a CPA license in Louisiana. The degree credit hours earned include the required accounting and business courses to be exam eligible.

Requirements to become a licensed CPA in Louisiana as set by the State Board of Certified Public Accountants of Louisiana for **Certified Public Accountant** include:

- Education
- Passage of the Uniform CPA Exam
- Professional Experience

The Louisiana Accountancy Act was changed effective August 1, 2026 to create three flexible, alternative educational and experience pathways to become a CPA in Louisiana. **Passing the CPA exam is required for all three pathways.**

- **Pathway 1:** Obtaining 150 hours of college education including baccalaureate degree with concentrations in accounting and business courses plus one year of professional experience.
- **Pathway 2:** Obtaining a higher degree beyond the baccalaureate degree (i.e., master's degree) with an accounting focus plus one year of professional experience.
- **Pathway 3:** Obtaining a baccalaureate degree with concentrations in accounting and business courses plus 2 years of professional experience.
